February 10th 2015 is Safer Internet Day, a day that is very important to our school and pupils. Safer Internet Day is run by the INSAFE network and is celebrated every year across Europe, and in other countries worldwide. This years theme is "Let's create a better internet together" where we will explore esafety issues and discuss the things we can all do to make sure the internet is a happy place for everyone.

To celebrate the many positives of the internet, and to raise awareness of the issues that children and young people face online today, we also plan to host an online safety information session for parents and carers of children on 2nd March at 2.45pm.

The session will provide practical advice and safety tips to help manage online safety issues, and discussions surrounding suitable behaviour online and should last around 30 minutes with light refreshments available.

We believe that internet safety education is a crucial element of the curriculum and an essential part of young people's development. This session is designed to help you become more aware of the safety messages that your children receive in school in order to reinforce them in your home environment.
