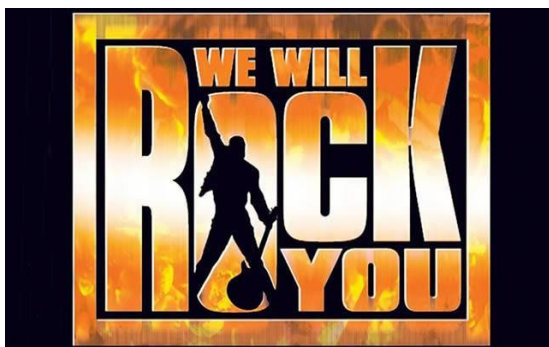
YEAR 2 TRIP TO @ BRISTOL.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS – Are you in receipt of Income Support, Job Seekers Allowance (Income Based), Child Tax Credit, Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit or Asylum Seeker Status? If so, even if you do not want your child to have a cooked lunch, please register your eligibility, as this has a significant impact on the amount of funding we receive in school. The more Free School Meals, the more money we receive into our budget! Please do not hesitate to come into the office if you require further in-formation or an application form.

If you are in receipt of Free School Meals you may be entitled to discounts on trips, music lessons, uniform and free attendance at Wheatfield Plus. Please let us know if you need any support. Thank you.

A FEW REMINDERS:

- For health and safety reasons, all children with hair longer than collar length, must have this secured in such a way, that the hair will not fall over their face or become tangled in a piece of apparatus or equipment.
- Fleeces should not be worn inside school as part of your child's uniform.
- Only small plain stud earrings may be worn and these must be removed for PE lessons.
- Sweets and chocolate must not form part of your child's packed lunch.

There were great numbers for week one although newcomers are welcome and will be pleased to know there are still a few places available so please book as soon as possible.

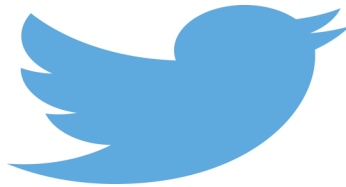
