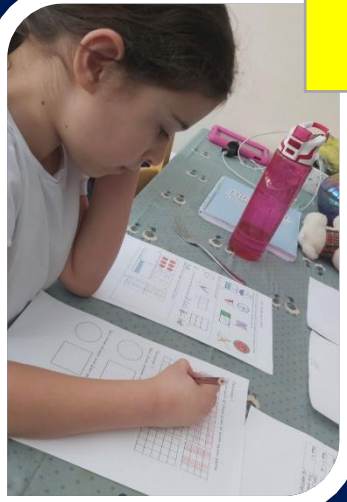
Teams Catch Ups

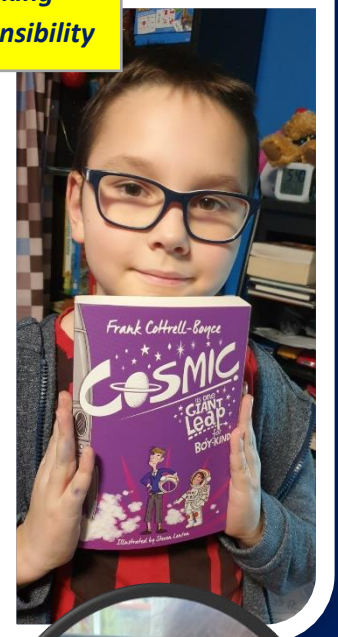

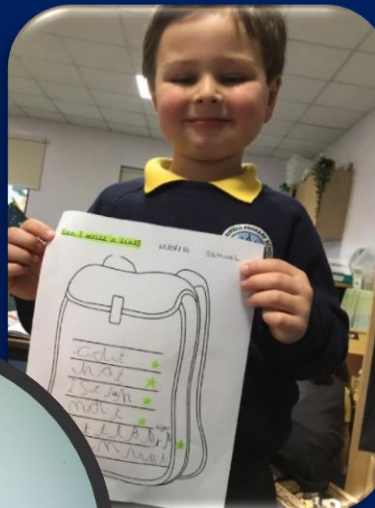
