Friday 2 April to Sunday 18 April	Email the Early Years-Schools Covid-19 Incident Mailbox: ey-schoolscovidincidents@southglos.gov.uk REMEMBER: Your whole household needs to self-isolate for 10 days from the start of symptoms / booking a test. If your child is at secondary school or college they will be carrying out rapid (lateral flow) tests at home over the Easter holidays. If their result is positive, you need to book your child a standard (PCR) Covid-19 test and your household must isolate until the result is known. Please report positive lateral flow and PCR test results to us using the email address above.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The name of the school / setting- The year group and class your child is in- When your child's symptoms started- When they were tested- What type of test they had (lateral flow or PCR)- When they were last in school We will reply to your email with any additional advice. We will contact the school if your child's positive result means a class bubble, including children and staff, need to isolate.
