Science Week

This week, we have continued our learning from Science Week (which was interrupted by the closure days). A big thank you to the parents who have given up time to talk about their work in science and also to Mrs Davies (our Science Leader) who helped plan the week before she started her maternity leave.

Year 3 completed several enquiries during science week. In one of these, we observed ice over time and measured the volume of water the ice ball lost every 20 minutes. We then plotted a line graph to show our results. After, we examined the effects of salt and food colouring on ice. We had great fun working scientifically, making predictions and observing the ice closely.



2B were lucky enough to have a visit from Sam's mum to talk about her role as a nurse. The children learnt how a blood pressure monitor works and had the opportunity to check each other's blood pressure. They were shown how to check each other's ears and throats and how to use a bandage. They had great fun – especially with the bandages!
